

INTERIM CAO's REPORT

April 24, 2018

1. The 2018 Alberta Community Crime Prevention Association (ACCPA) 2018 Conference is scheduled for May 8 – 10 in Edmonton. This year's theme, 'New Directions in Community Safety', will focus on four areas of discussion: Societal Issues impacting Alberta communities (marijuana legalization and the opioid crisis); Social Development Initiatives and Responses; Downtown Revitalization and other Planned Approaches to Community Safety; and Industry Partnerships in Support of Safe Communities. Delegates also have the option of attending one of the following three workshop sessions on May 8: Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) for Rural and Small Population Communities; Aligning Systems and Collaboration in Crime Prevention; or, Understanding, Recognizing, and Preventing Radicalization Leading to Violence. A motion authorizing attendance (as per policy) is required.
2. At the February 27, 2018, regular council meeting, Council's direction was to meet with the Council Compensation Committee to provide information on councillor's duties and time commitments on either April 24 or May 8. As per the Committee Chair, the Committee suggests that a meeting is no longer required as councillors' responses to the Committee's email questionnaire provided sufficient information for the preparation of committee recommendations. The Chair also noted the Committee's work is on schedule for presenting a final report to Council by June 26.
3. Roger Smolnicky, Director of Recreation and Community Services, Town of Rocky Mountain House, informed Administration that on April 17, Town Council adopted its 2018 Capital Budget which includes allocations of Town reserves for the Spray Park and North Saskatchewan River Park community projects. Administration requested that Mr. Smolnicky attend a regular council meeting in the near future to provide Council with additional details on these projects.
4. Rocky Mountain House Search & Rescue is hosting the 2018 Mountain Rescue Association Conference at the Goldeye Centre on June 7 – 10. They wish to invite the Reeve, or designate, to bring greetings at the Opening Ceremony on the evening of June 7.
