

Clearwater County residents have asked for more detailed information about the County's broadband project. This dedicated newsletter is part of our commitment to provide transparent, factual updates about the work underway. These e-newsletter updates will continue on a regular basis as the project moves forward. Below you will find background on how this project developed, what is being built, who is involved, and what choices residents and businesses have.

**A project more than 20 years in the making**

Improving internet access in Clearwater County is not a new idea. The County has been studying, planning, and advocating for better broadband for more than two decades.

Over that time:

- Residents and businesses consistently identified reliable internet as a major challenge
- Technology options evolved from wireless and satellite to fibre-based solutions
- Provincial and federal governments introduced funding programs focused on rural broadband
- Clearwater County evaluated multiple delivery models and funding opportunities before moving forward

The current broadband project is the result of long-term planning, feasibility studies, and approved funding applications. It is not a sudden or externally driven initiative.

**What the County is building**

Clearwater County is constructing a County-owned fibre network. This network is infrastructure, like roads or utilities, designed to improve long-term connectivity across the County for its residents and businesses.

Key points:

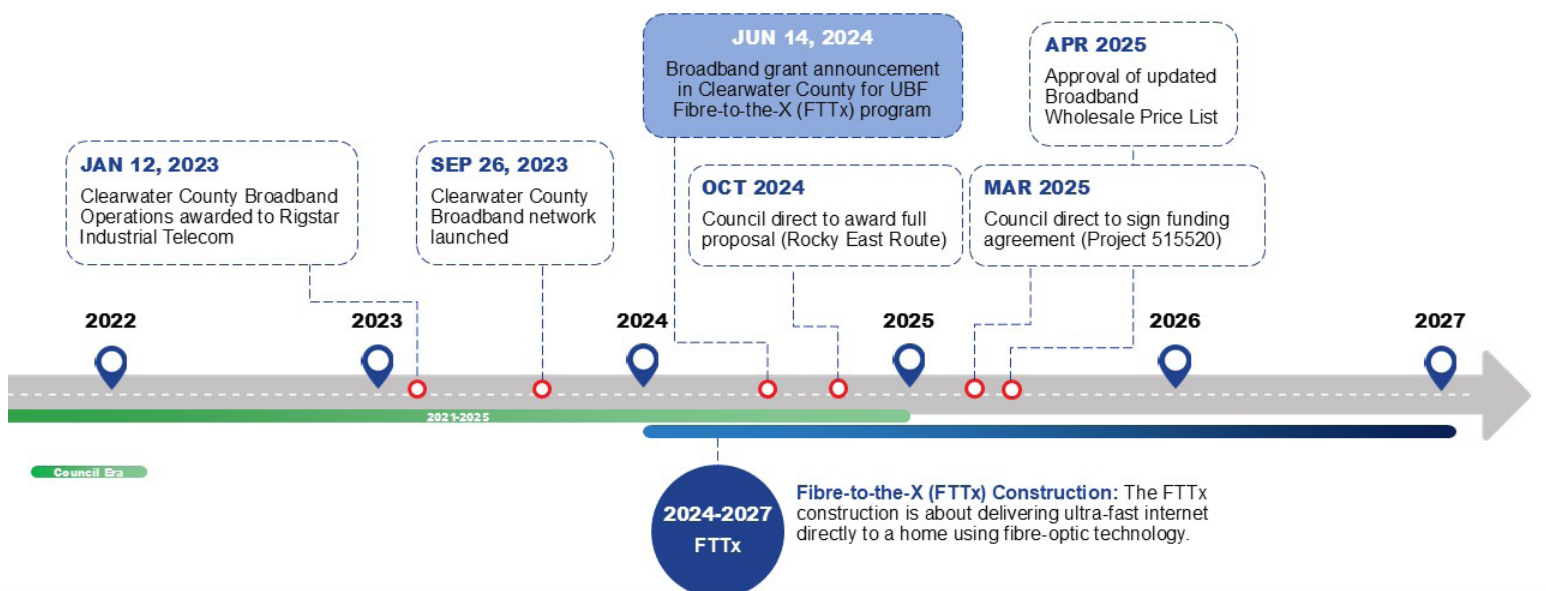
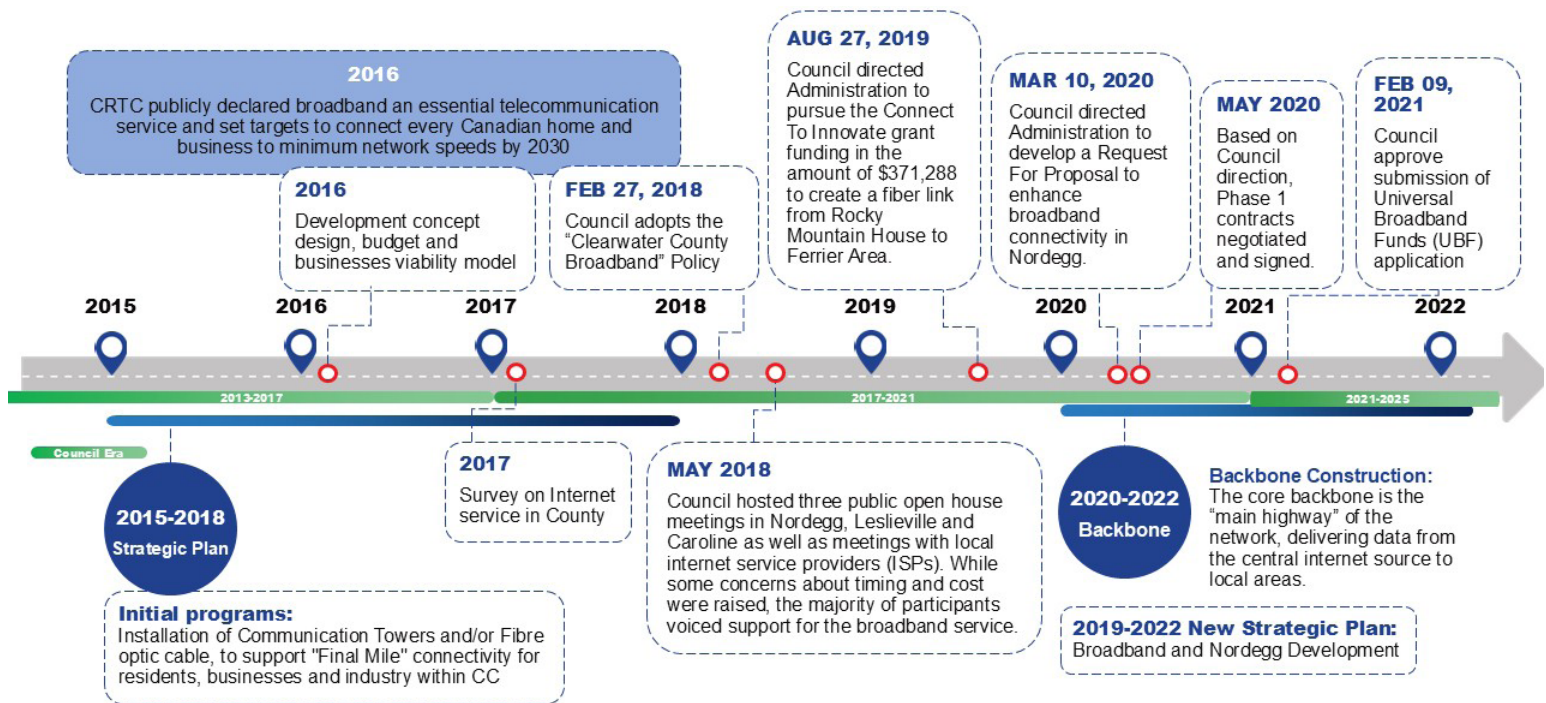
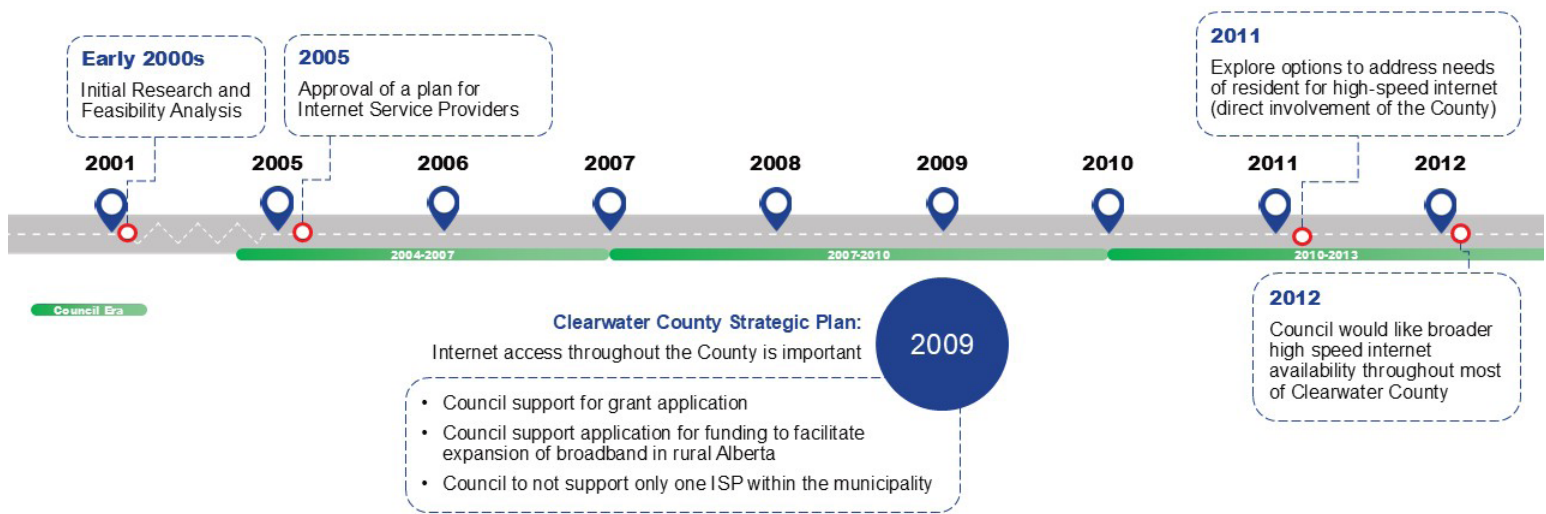
- The fibre network is owned 100% by Clearwater County
- It is open-access, meaning no single internet provider controls it - more choice and no monopoly
- It creates the foundation for improved internet services now and in the future
- Residents are not required to connect or subscribe and may continue using existing services

**Internet service providers**

Internet service providers (ISPs) lease the County-owned fibre network to offer their own internet services to residents and businesses at the rates and packages they determine.

- Clearwater County does not sell internet services directly to residents
- Residents and businesses choose if and when they want to sign up, and which providers best meet their needs
- The County has received interest from at least 5 internet service providers and is currently in the process of signing service level agreements with each.
- Additional providers may join over time, including those offering services beyond internet

## What is Fibre Connect?

Fibre Connect is an optional program that allows a property to be connected from the fibre line at the municipal access point on the road to their home or business.

Important details:

- Fibre Connect prepares a property for future internet service
- Signing up does not require purchasing internet service
- There is no obligation to choose a provider immediately
- It is a one-time infrastructure connection, not a subscription
- Over 400 residents have already signed up for Fibre Connect since the end of November

An early bird rate of \$399 for the first 100m, plus \$14/m beyond that, is currently available. Once the overall network construction is completed, the standard rate of \$1500 for the first 100m will apply. The County's contractor AFL, is currently working in communities across the County, assisting with Fibre Connect signups.

## Why some areas are being built first

Construction is happening in phases across Clearwater County. Areas were selected based on:

- Eligibility requirements tied to provincial and federal funding programs.
- Areas with internet service below the minimum standard of 50 Mbps/10 Mbps were prioritized
- Engineering feasibility, existing infrastructure and construction logistics
- Population density and potential impact
- Cost considerations and overall project impact

Approximately 75% of construction costs in the initial build areas are funded through provincial and federal government grant programs. Clearwater County is currently reviewing options to extend the network to additional areas that were not eligible under those programs.

## Common questions we are hearing

### Is participation mandatory?

No. Participation is optional. Some residents may not require the reliability or speeds offered by high-speed fibre internet.

### Who controls the network?

The network is owned by Clearwater County and operated under approved agreements. There is no foreign ownership, no third-party control, and no major telecommunications company is involved.

### Do I need to decide now?

No. Residents can choose to wait and decide later. The only time-limited offer at this time, is the Fibre Connect early bird pricing.

### When will the network be ready to deliver internet services?

The network will be ready in Spring 2026 and dependent on the construction status in each neighbourhood. To check the construction status for your property, please visit: [market.cwcbb.ca](https://market.cwcbb.ca)

### When will the construction be completed?

Grant funding requires that all construction must be completed by March 31, 2027.
