- 1. Clearwater County COVID-19 Update:
 - Effective May 25, Clearwater County facilities reopened for public access, in accordance with the Provincial Relaunch Strategy and workplace recommendations. Please refer to the County's phased Relaunch Strategy (attached) to help protect staff and members of the public while on County premises. Please note that Rocky Mountain Regional Solid Waste Authority Reuse Centre, Transfer Scale and Landfill Offices remain closed to public access.
 - Although County facilities are reopened, the public is encouraged to continue using phone, email or online for County business. For easy and convenient payment of services, property taxes and other transactions, please refer to Payment Options bulletin (attached).
 - The County's Emergency Coordination Centre (ECC) will be deactivated; however, evaluation of Provincial updates to confirm any additional restrictions that may be required or those that can be lifted, along with other operational considerations, will continue.
 - Regular Council meetings continue as scheduled, staff and public are encouraged to watch meetings via livestream.
 - Health order requirements for physical distancing (2 metres) and mass gathering restrictions (15 people or less) remain in effect in all circumstances.

- The Government of Alberta recently announced rescission of 'A Coal Development Policy for Alberta (Coal Policy), effective June 1: <u>Information about the rescinded</u> <u>Coal Policy</u>.

The following CBC News article: <u>Alberta rescinds decades-old policy that banned open-pit coal mines in Rockies and Foothills.</u>, references proposed coal mining projects within the Foothills region that are located in Clearwater County, near Rocky Mountain House.

It is anticipated that with this change to coal regulations, there may be potential impacts on future development in the County. Administration has contacted Ram River Coal Corporation to inquire on the status of the proposed <u>Aries Project</u> for mining coking coal, the impact of these regulation changes on the project and, invite delegates to update Council at a future regular meeting.
